There Is No God

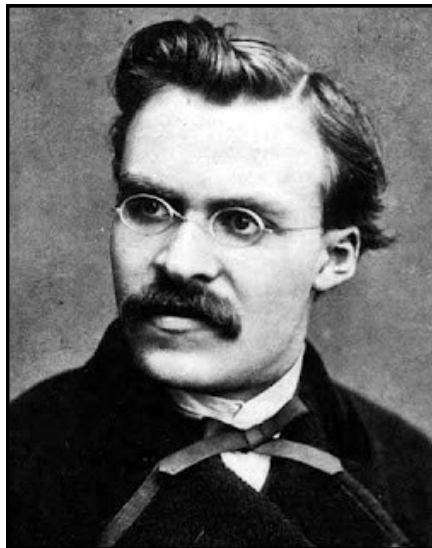
Some people do not believe in the existence of God. Some people believe in a god, but not the one, true God of the Bible. Others believe in God, but do not let him be a part of their life.

Regardless of one's denial of the existence of God, the consequence is the same - a life without God. The question that we want to explore in this articles is, "What is a life without God like?"

Life Without God

When a person does not have God in his or her life, they can easily be living a life of hurting self and others (Psalm 14:1-4; 36:1-4; 52:1-7; 54:3; Ecclesiastes 8:2,11,13; Jeremiah 10:25; Ex. 5:2; Rom. 13:2; 1 Jn. 4:8).

A life without God is a life without an objective, fixed, set of moral principles. And without this set of principles, anything goes. It was Fyodor Dostoyevsky who famously said, "Without God all things are permitted." This is true. No God, no rules other than your own rules.

So, people without God in their lives often engage in terrorism, violence, murder, robbery, vandalism, etc. Marriages end in abuse and divorce. Mothers get an abortion, children kill off their parents with euthanasia, etc. Does this describe you?

When a person does not have God in his or her life, they could be living a life out of control, growing worse and worse (Jeremiah 9:3; Rom. 1:21-31; Galatians 4:8-9; Ephesians 4:17-19; 1 Thessalonians 4:4-6; Titus 1:16)

A "no God" person will likely engage in sexual immorality which often leads to sexually transmitted diseases. Sometimes they will engage in drug or alcohol abuse. Sometimes they will incur massive amounts of debt through gambling some other form of irresponsible behavior. Does this describe you?

When a person does not have God in his or her life, they will often live a life of self-centered pride (Psalm 10:2-11; Acts 12:23; 1 Corinthians 1:21).

These people often focus on what they want. World dictators will make war because it best suits their ego. Hollywood celebrities will live in sexual immorality because it best suits their ego. Powerful businessmen exploit women and intelligent educators promote atheism all because they can. Does this describe you?

When a person does not have God in his or her life, they will often live without hope (Ephesians 2:12). - cont.
