## Spiritual Sickness Can Be Deadly

How bad is your sickness? Well, all sin brings spiritual death (Romans 6:23). Spiritual sickness can also grow and get worse (Isaiah 1:5), and spiritual sickness left untreated will result in eternal death (Revelations 21:8).

Elderly people can become sick and older Christians can become spiritually sick (Galatians 5:7). In fact, everyone can become sick at some point in their life, and any Christian can become spiritually sick as well (I Corinthians 11:30).

#### **Spiritual Sicknesses Diagnosed**

How can we know that we are spiritually sick? What are the symptoms? What is the diagnosis? Here are a few things to look for in your life. Are you ...

- Divisive and contentious (I Corinthians 1:10-11)?
- Fleshly minded (Galatians 5:19-21)?
- Tossed back and forth by error (Ephesians 4:14)?
- Refusing to work together (Phil. 4:2)?
- Lacking in growth (Hebrews 5:12-14)?
- Following human wisdom (Colossians 2:8ff)?
- Disorderly (2 Thessalonians 3:6)?

- Drifting and falling away from Jesus (Hebrews 2:1; 3:12; 4:1ff)?
- Forsaking the assembling more often (Hebrews 10:25)?
- Fighting and worldly (James 4:1-4)?
- Lukewarm (Revelation 3:16-19)?
