

Wholly Follow the Lord

Friend, how well do you follow the Lord? Some today will follow the Lord with their whole heart like Judah in the days of Asa (2 Chronicles 15:12-15), while others will not wholly follow like Judah in the days of Jeremiah (Jeremiah 3:10).

When I think of someone in the Bible who was known for following the Lord wholly, I think of Joshua and Caleb (Numbers 32:11-12).

Looking at the life of Caleb in the Bible you will find what it means to wholly follow the Lord. It means to follow the Lord in all circumstances. Caleb followed the Lord even when the Israelites did not want to (Numbers 13:30-33). It means to follow the Lord with all your heart. Caleb had "another spirit" (heart, attitude) that was different from the disobedient Israelites (Numbers 14:24). It means to follow the Lord all your days. Caleb followed the Lord all throughout the wilderness wanderings until he was 85 years old (Joshua 14:8-10). Will you do this?

You too can wholly follow the Lord. You can wholly praise the Lord (Psa. 9:1). You can wholly follow God's precepts (Psalm 119:2, 10, 34, 58, 69). You can wholly follow the Lord in your prayers (Psalm 119:45), in your penitence (Jeremiah 24:7), in your purity (1 Thessalonians 5:23), and in your progress (1 Timothy 4:15). Be a Caleb!
