Go Into All the World

Go ye therefore, and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them into the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit: teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I commanded you: and lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world
- Matthew 28:19-20 -

And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to the whole creation. He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that disbelieves shall be condemned.
- Mark 16:15-16 -

Who Will Go?

Jesus wanted his disciples to go into all the world and preach the gospel. He wants us to follow their example and go ourselves into all the world. The New Testament church understood this (Acts 8:4) and we should understand it for ourselves today. We should go into all the world and preach the gospel! My question is: Who will go? Which one of us will go? Will we make excuses for not going, or will we go?


Some Christians today don't go at all. They are like Barak who would not go to fight the Canaanites unless Deb-

orah went with him:

And Barak said unto her, If thou wilt go with me, then I will go; but if thou wilt not go with me, I will not go (Judges 4:8)

Some Christians today would prefer that someone else go in their place (the preacher, etc.). They are like Moses who asked the Lord to send someone else:

And he said, Oh, Lord, send, I pray thee, by the hand of him whom thou wilt send (Exodus 4:13)



Some Christians today would rather run away from their responsibility, than go into all the world and preach. They are like Jonah who ran the opposite direction of where the Lord wanted him to go:

Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and cry against it; for their wickedness is come up before me. But Jonah rose up to flee unto Tar-

shish from the presence of Jehovah; and he went down to Joppa, and found a ship going to Tarshish: so he paid the fare thereof, and went down into it, to go with them unto Tarshish from the presence of Jehovah (Jonah 1:2-3)

Some Christians would rather put off their responsibility for something else. They are like the two would-be followers of Jesus who had more important things to do:

And he said unto another, Follow me. But he said, Lord, suffer me first to go and bury my father. But he said unto him, Leave the dead to bury their own dead; but go thou and publish abroad the kingdom of God. And another also said, I will follow thee, Lord; but first suffer me to bid farewell to them that are at my house. But Jesus said unto him, No man, having put his hand to the plow, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God (Luke 9:59-62)

But, there are some faithful Christians who will step up and go. They are like Isaiah who said, "Here am I, Lord, send me" (Isaiah 6:8) and they are like Paul who answered the Macedonian call: "Come over and help us" (Acts 16:9-10).
